The Mansion House is the official residence of the Lord Mayor of London. It is a Grade I listed building. Designed by George Dance in the Palladian style, it was built primarily in the 1740s.

It is the official home of the Lord Mayor of London and scene of two important annual dinners, one addressed by the Foreign Secretary the other by the Chancellor of the Exchequer.

The building was paid for by one of the less edifying devices in City history.

There are superb collections of painting, silver plate and ceremonial swords. The residence used to contain a court of law, the last private home to do so, as the Lord Mayor is the chief magistrate of the City while in office.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION:

By 2.50 meet outside the Lord Mayor's entrance in Walbrook. Travel: train or underground to Cannon St then walk up Walbrook past St Stephen's church (currently closed). Alternatively, go to Bank station (Central line and DLR); the station has sixteen exits, all poorly and confusingly signposted. If you do not know your way ask for help getting out via the "bull-ring" and Exit 8.

There are several cafes nearby, of you need to kill time.
